



The Smithsonian and the American Library Association (ALA) have developed a new traveling exhibition on human evolution based on the iconic "David H. Koch Hall of Human Origins" at the National Museum of Natural History in Washington, D.C. "Exploring Human Origins: What Does It Mean to Be Human?" is touring a limited number of seminaries, and Saint Paul School of Theology has been selected to host in Spring 2025.

"This exhibition is all about integrating scientific discoveries from around the globe and making them available for everyone to see," said Rick Potts, director of the Smithsonian's Human Origins Program and curator of the traveling exhibition. "We hope that it will spark a

respectful and positive conversation across the country about what it means to be human and inspire people to contemplate their place in the natural world."


This exhibit will be set up in the Kansas Campus Commons through the Spring semester of 2025.


Pause/Play is the sole space focused on the soul of preachers, one that is both a sanctuary and a wellspring of play.

Chapel

We gather weekly—on campuses and online to reorient the whole of our individual and collective life around the triune God. Saint Paul's liturgy is the intentional work of the people at prayer, praise, and service; a unique chance for students, staff, and faculty to worship together. When you are in chapel, you are in a sacred space because the Holy Spirit knows no limits! Zoom participants are encouraged to create a space for chapel wherever they are. Gather elements that ground you—a stone, a candle, an icon, candles, a pet, etc. We celebrate the eucharist the last Tuesday of every month. If you are in chapel through Zoom, you are encouraged to have communion elements prepared ahead of time.

Knowing we are a diverse body, we are enhanced by the heritage of song, prayer, art, posture, music, movement, and preaching each liturgist brings to the worship gathering. Chapel Time/Location

We are one seminary with two campuses and many locations. Chapel is always hybrid, using a Zoom Link throughout the year (https://zoom.us/j/91407665808). Oklahoma City gathers in the Harris Chapel on the campus of OCU. Leawood gathers in Building C of Church of the Resurrection in C136.

Chapel starts at 11:00 am CST on Zoom every Tuesday (except for Focus week, Reading week, Forum weeks, and weeks off school) and is followed by a community meal.

Spiritual Formation

We explore a different practice each week such as lectio divina, breath prayers, icon prayers, contemplative walking, examen, guided imagery, or creating art. Setting aside an hour to breathe deeply and care for our minds, bodies, and spirits can have a profound impact on our wellbeing.

After a brief introduction, we spend approximately 15 minutes engaging with the practice, followed by 15 minutes of journaling and contemplation. The group is then open for sharing, prayer requests, or other reflections. Before we close, an intercessory prayer is prayed on behalf of the group. Some practices will take us outdoors or to other sacred spaces. Others may require items such as candles, art supplies, or objects from nature. These will always be posted in the Campus Messenger well ahead of time. w


